the Saturday racing being cancelled. However, the racing did take place on the Sunday with two races in the morning and two races in the afternoon. A great event supported by volunteers within the Club. Congratulations to the highest Lancing helm Will Apps.

Maintenance of the Club especially in its seafront location is an ongoing issue. This months big task was to replace the winch cable with a brand new cable which helps take the effort out of bringing the heavier dinghies and rescue boats up the beach. Big shout out to Mike C (the Winch Master) and his assistant Barry.

This has been a great summer for the beach but not so for gardens and water supplies. Whilst not directly affected by hosepipe bans in the area the Club has decided to stop the use of the hosepipe to wash boats down on the beach to play our part in preserving water. No doubt it will rain soon.

The Club runs inhouse sailing training on Saturdays through the season when the tides are lower. This is to help our less experienced helms and crews pick up tips and experience to take them on through to the next step. We often see 10 boats out on the water with sailors of different ages. It includes Sammy who is using the sailing as part of completing his Duke of Edinburgh Award.

The first Summer series races concluded on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> with all six races of the series being sailed. Top spots went to Andy C (Aero) in the fast fleet, Tom W in his Laser/ICLA 7 medium fleet and Angela D in her Topper for the slow fleet.



On Saturday 19th July after a great deal of time, effort and planning by Gill our Social Secretary and all her team the Club hosted a family fun day with the main aim of raising funds for the Shoreham Lifeboat. There was a good turnout with members bringing items for a buffet lunch. Despite variable weather as shown in these photos, great variety of fun was had on the beach with paddleboard and kayak racing,





a sailing pursuit race, as well as some beach games for our younger members. A great day of fun under the sun and it kept Graham behind the bar busy. The event and generosity of those who attended meant that we went along way towards the annual donation to the lifeboat which we hope will be over £500.
